



What is Orbit?	Orbit is a free-to-use child sexual abuse prevention program aimed at children aged between 8 and 10 created by the University of the Sunshine Coast in partnership with the Telstra Foundation, the Daniel Morcombe Foundation and the Queensland Police Service. Handling of information	Data will be stored securely with direct access only by the researchers. Data may be used in future associated research projects.
